 - National Health Service Corps & Nurse Corps (Site approvals, Loan Repayment Payment & Scholarship)







Strategy 4-Improve maternal health outcomes

- Reduce maternal deaths
- Increase the proportion of pregnant women who receive early and adequate prenatal care



Strategy 5-Enhanced access to primary care

- Increase the proportion of adults with limited English proficiency who say their providers explain things clearly
- Reduce the proportion of people who can't get medical care when they need it
- Increase the proportion of adults who get recommended evidence-based preventive health care
- Increase the number of community organizations that provide prevention services


Benefits to Referring Hospitals

- → Practitioners and staff back to the bedside
- → Ease of transfers
- → Enhanced equitable access to care
- → Public Health Emergency response infrastructure
- → Single point of contact
- → Robust data
- → Electronic record of transfer
- → Seat at the regular governance council meetings

Benefits to Public Health

- → Real time data of health of the healthcare system
- → Regional mapping of services
- → Immediate re-activation of Surge Line possible
- → Ability to adapt to public health emergencies
 - Respiratory season (*tested in 2022)
 - ◆ Pandemic
 - Mass Casualty Incident
