This project supported key opportunities for the career advancement of indigenous healthcare professionals, helping them achieve their goals of obtaining advance certification and training through place-based, accessible and affordable healthcare education and certification. This approach improved both individual professional careers and the healthcare services of the tribal communities served by these professionals.


AMERICAN INDIAN HEALTH-AHEC

American Indian Health Workforce Development

Program Description:

Partnering with school districts and educational organizations, AIH-AHEC initiated numerous activities throughout the state promoting health career programs. These efforts 1) provided enhanced youth and clinical workforce education and career development opportunities, and 2) created a pathway for current health care professionals working in Tribal Health Care facilities to enhance their professional skills through certification/training programs which will impact their communities.

Program Goals:





► Invest in and retain current health care professionals working in Tribal communities to advance their professional contributions within their communities.

CDC COVID-19 Health Disparities Grant Strategies:

Strategy 1: Expand existing and/or develop new mitigation and prevention resources and services to reduce COVID-19-related disparities among populations at higher risk and that are underserved.

Strategy 4: Mobilize partners and collaborators to advance health equity and address social determinants of health as they relate to COVID-19 health disparities among populations at higher risk and that are underserved.





Milestones:



With Gila River Health Care, organized the "Exploring Nursing Education and Patient Care" Conference, designed to enhance professional development. Over 60% of attendees received Continuing Education credits.

- Developed an AHEAD Indigenous Healthcare Career Advancement Training Funding Application to advance skills and provide certification opportunities to healthcare professionals in specialized areas. To date 75 applicants have obtained certification.
- Over 83 health care professionals working in Tribal Health Care facilities across 15 Arizona Tribal communities were provided Professional Development stipends for varieties of certification and/or training to benefit career paths and communities.
- Assisted 10 nursing healthcare professionals employed by Tribal facilities to obtain Sexual Abuse Nursing Certification (SANE).

- Sponsored the 2024 Indians in Nursing: Career Advancement and Transition Scholars Program (INCATS) Tribal-Academic-Practice-Partnership Summit. Over 35 current nursing students and professionals. Board and Health Care facility representatives met to identify barriers facing Native American students and develop strategies.
- Submitted the White Paper: "Addressing Health **Profession Career Disparities in Native-Serving** High Schools in Arizona and working with Native American communities' Institutional Review Boards (IRBs)"



Stepping into the future:

AIH-AHEC will continue to collaborate with Native-serving high schools to create clear educational pathways

from secondary education to health careers and thus improve the understanding of and address the barriers facing American Indian students. AIH-AHEC will seek additional funding support to continue with the professional development training of current health care professionals committed to working within Tribal Health Care facilities.
