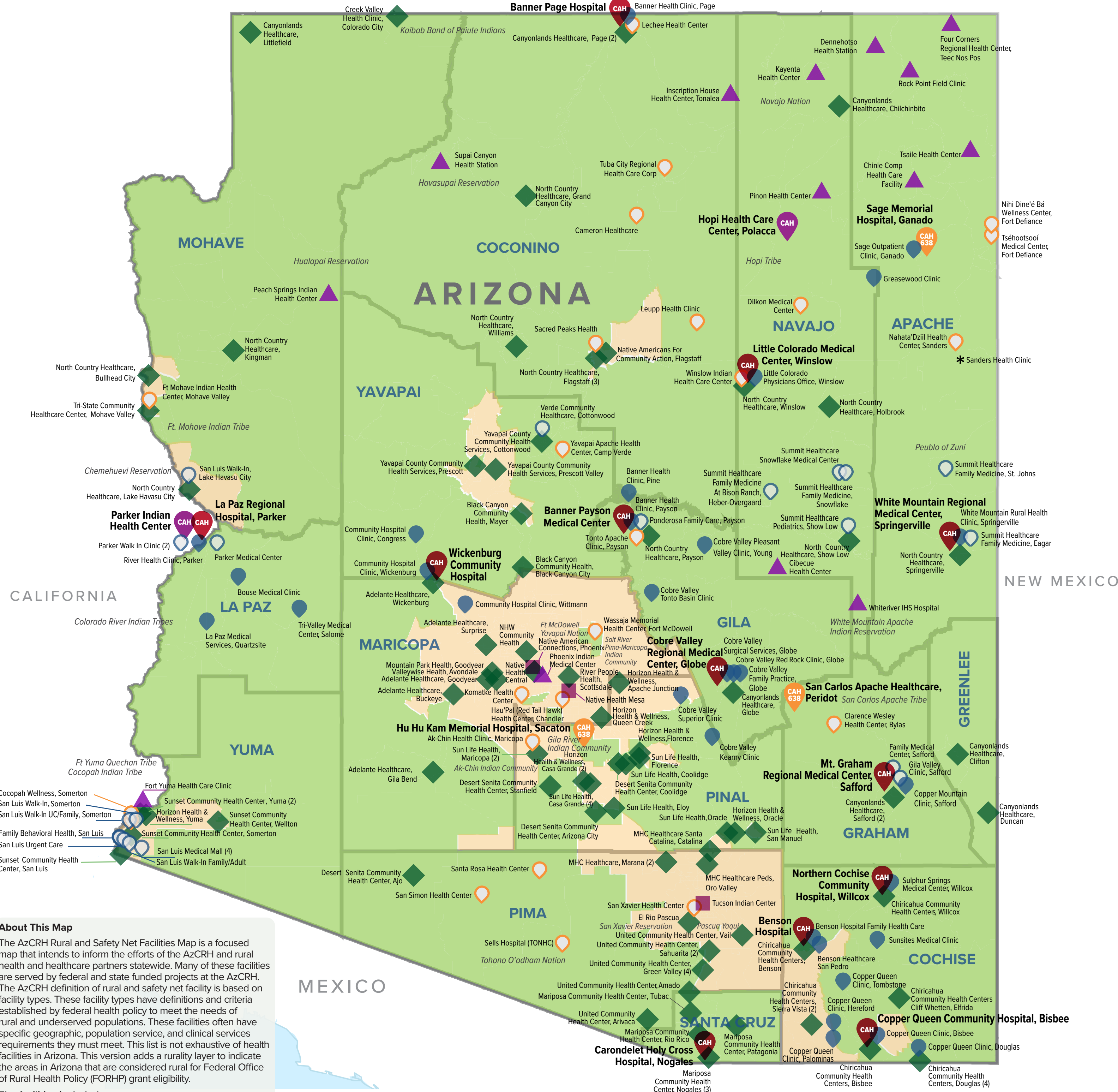


# RURAL & SAFETY NET HEALTH FACILITIES IN ARIZONA

**About This Map**

The AzCRH Rural and Safety Net Facilities Map is a focused map that intends to inform the efforts of the AzCRH and rural health and healthcare partners statewide. Many of these facilities are served by federal and state funded projects at the AzCRH. The AzCRH definition of rural and safety net facility is based on facility types. These facility types have definitions and criteria established by federal health policy to meet the needs of rural and underserved populations. These facilities often have specific geographic, population service, and clinical services requirements they must meet. This list is not exhaustive of health facilities in Arizona. This version adds a rurality layer to indicate the areas in Arizona that are considered rural for Federal Office of Rural Health Policy (FORHP) grant eligibility.

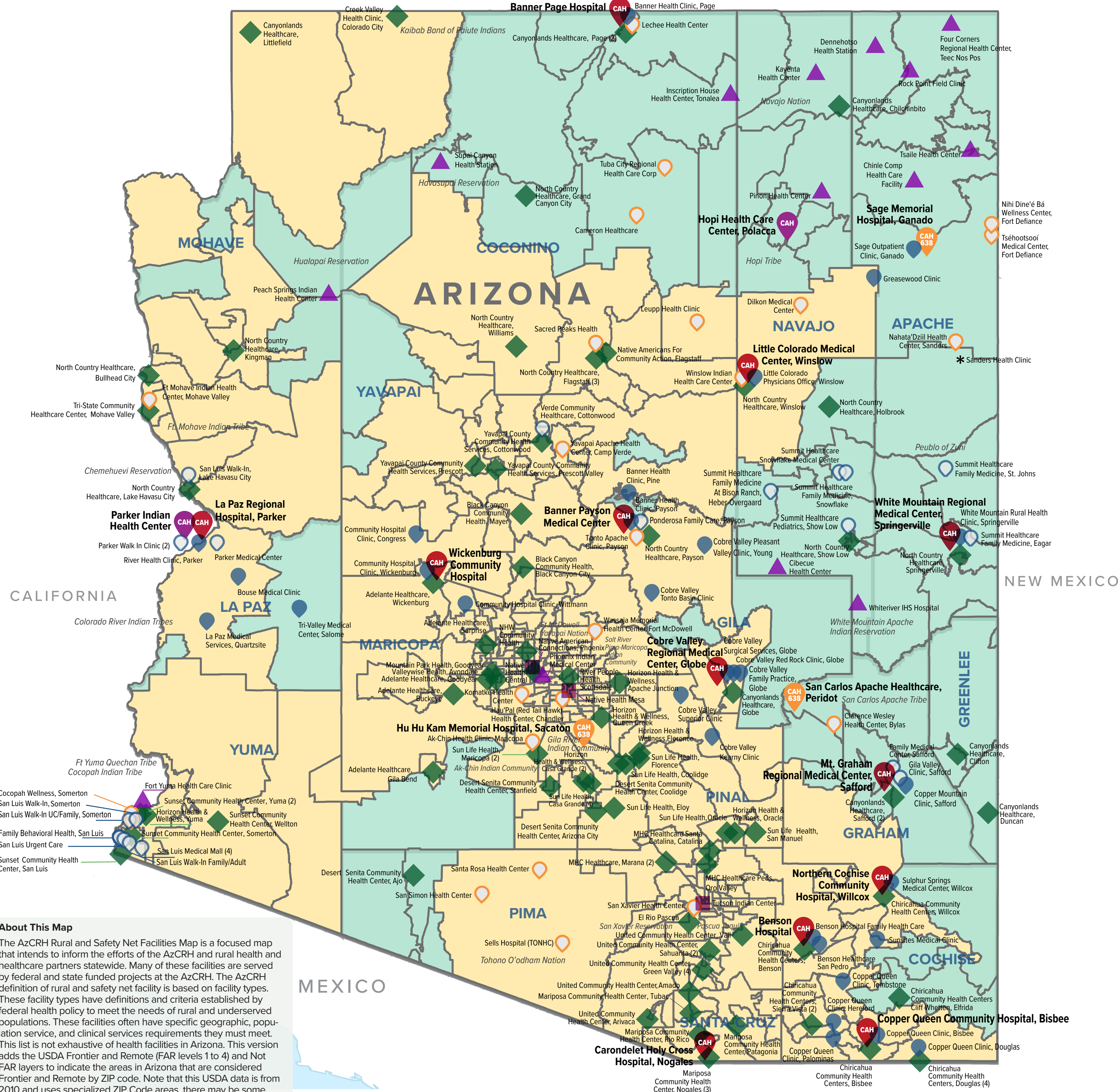

These facilities often have specific geographic, population service, and clinical services requirements they must meet. This list is not exhaustive of health facilities in Arizona. This version adds the USDA Frontier and Remote (FAR levels 1 to 4) and Not FAR layers to indicate the areas in Arizona that are considered Frontier and Remote by ZIP code. Note that this USDA data is from 2010 and uses specialized ZIP Code areas, there may be some differences between this map and USDA maps.
