



2020 Tobacco Package Summary

- **SB 1063 (Quezada) Electronic Smoke Devices; Billboards:**
States that tobacco products, including electronic smoking devices may not be advertised within 1000 feet of a school or public playground.

Allows for local ordinances that are more restrictive than the state minimum standard and allows for a complete ban of billboard advertising of tobacco products, including electronic smoking devices.
- **HB 2173 (Kavanagh) smoking regulation; electronic smoking devices**
Incorporates electronic cigarettes into the Clean Indoor Air laws in Arizona. Specifies that electronic products cannot be used in the indoor spaces where commercial tobacco is not allowed.
- **HB 2636 (Blackman) electronic smoking devices; retail licensing**
Establishes a tobacco retail license for the state of Arizona. The license defines tobacco to include electronic products and requires all tobacco retailers to obtain a retail license in order to continue to sell tobacco products. Establishes a tiered penalty structure for noncompliance with the federal tobacco sales age of 21. Conforms Arizona statutes to federal statutes and references the federal law that specifies the tobacco sale age.
- **HB 2637 (Blackman) smoking devices; tobacco products; definitions**
Corrects the definition of tobacco to include electronic products. Current these products are defined as vapor products in Arizona statute.

Other Tobacco Bills that we Support

HB 2258 (Thorpe) appropriation; alcohol; tobacco; drug education

Requests a \$1,000,000 appropriation to educate students about a variety of issues, including commercial tobacco and e-cigarettes.
