Program overview: The University of Arizona Comprehensive Pain and Addiction Center, in collaboration with the Workforce Development Program, the Colleges of Public Health and Medicine, and the Arizona Center for Rural Health launched Project FUTRE, Families Uplifted Through Recovery Education. The goal of Project FUTRE is to increase the number of behavioral health paraprofessionals who are trained to work with children and families impacted by opioid use disorder (OUD) and other substance use disorders (SUDs) in Pima and Santa Cruz counties. The Comprehensive Pain and Addiction Center initiative 2.3C will help lead Arizona and the nation to implement a socio-psycho-biological approach to pain management, substance misuse, and addiction.

Position Summary: Collaborate with the Comprehensive Pain and Addiction Center to evaluate Project FUTRE and support efforts for both Project FUTRE and CPAC at large.

Essential Functions: *Project FUTRE:* Conducts and organizes results of Project FUTRE evaluation efforts, coordinates next steps with the Evaluation Co-Investigator, and supports Project FUTRE programmatic improvements. *CPAC:* Writes policy one pagers, drafts reports and grants, and supports evaluation and strategic planning efforts.

Ideal candidate: The ideal candidate will be a graduate degree seeking student in the University of Arizona Health Sciences and must be enrolled in at least 6 units in Spring and Fall semester 2021. The student should possess the following knowledge and skills:

- Knowledge of public health evaluation.
- Familiarity with social determinants of health.
- Familiarity with opioid use and overdose risk factors.
- Skill with collection and analysis of data.
- Experienced user of Microsoft Excel.
- Experience with building REDCap data collection instruments or willing to learn.
- Ability to effectively communicate.
