

## CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS

# 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Arizona Rural Health Conference

July 25 & 26, 2017 • High Country Conference Center, Flagstaff, Arizona

Submitting an application for a concurrent or poster presentation is a great opportunity to showcase your program, project, internship projects or research.

All presentations should relate to the conference theme ***Making the Case for Rural Health and Wellness*** and address one of the three tracks and suggested content under each track (on second page):

**Track 1:** *Community Health & Adolescent Health*

**Track 2:** *Economic Impact & Workforce Development*

**Track 3:** *Access to Care & Health Insurance Coverage*

### ■ Concurrent Presentations

- The number of presentations can include up to (9) – 1 hour slots; (18) – 30 minute slots; or a combination within each track. A laptop, LCD projector and screen will be set up for the presenters' use.

#### **One hour Presentation:**

- ✓ Should include a 10 minute question and answer segment.
- ✓ Can include up to 3 presenters.

#### **30 minute Presentations:**

- ✓ Should include a 5 minute question and answer segment.
- ✓ Can include up to 2 presenters

**Review Criteria** – presentations will be rated on the following criteria:

- Relevance to the conference theme and selected track
- Well-defined focus and solution oriented
- Specific and achievable learning objectives
- Clarity and completeness of presentation description
- Demonstrate successful strategies or “best practice” models.

NOTE: Based on the number of presentations, the selection committee can recommend shortening your presentation.

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### ■ Lightning Rounds Poster Presentations

- The lightning rounds poster presentations are scheduled for Tuesday, July 25 from 3:15 – 4:15. Up to 15 presentations will be selected – five presentations per track. Only two presenters per presentation will be allowed.

#### **The 'lightning rounds' sessions will be conducted as follows:**

- ✓ Each presentation will be approximately 10 minutes in length
- ✓ A 10-minute Q&A session will follow after all five presentations.
- ✓ A moderator will be assigned.
- Presenters will prepare a handout with a summary of their presentation and contact information.
- Poster boards will be provided and the dimension will be included in the notification letter.

**Review Criteria** – presentations will be rated on the following criteria:

- Relevance to the conference theme and selected track
- Well-defined focus and solution oriented
- Clarity and completeness of presentation description

## ■ Conference Track and Suggested Content (content is not limited to list below)

### Track 1: Community Health & Adolescent Health

- Adolescents drop off from accessing care; only access if sport physical is needed.
- Children's with Special Health Care Needs & those transitioning from pediatrics to adult care.
- Support schools to address bullying. Behavioral Health Intervention should be available for the child being bullied and the child doing the bullying.
- Address Child Services at all levels particularly in foster care systems where treatment options are minimal.
- Integration of social determinant of health in education/school settings
- Coordinated health needs assessment – where are priorities and how are they being framed.
- Communities Infrastructure Improvements
- Chronic disease management program integration in primary care
- Autism
- Opioid Epidemic

### Track 2: Economic Impact & Workforce Development

- Triple Aim Approach: Encompasses wide net of topics.
- Economic drives patient health care.
- Showcase how telemedicine programs support economic development clinical trials, electronic health systems and tele-health equipment.
- Opportunity to learn about companies offering technology for health care systems
- Highlight work of the State Loan Repayment Program and opportunity for growth.
- Preceptor for Medical provider
- Find out about resources offered by workforce programs in Arizona.
- Health Professions Education – Key to Recruitment & Retention

### Track 3: Access to Care & Health Insurance Coverage

- Insurance coverage outreach across state
- Capping benefits to tribes; looking at HRSA funding to leverage tribal monies.
- How to leverage FMAP congress appropriated HRSA funds.
